

RESPONSIVENESS OF THE CENTER FOR ENTREPRENEURIAL AND LIVELIHOOD EDUCATION AND NETWORKING (CELEN) PROGRAMS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF MAKATI

ABSTRACT

*The study tried to measure the extent of the benefits gained in the social, economic, political, cultural and technological developments of the programs implemented by the Center for Entrepreneurial and Livelihood Education and Networking Office of the University of Makati. The study involved a total number of 200 respondents, 140 of which were senior students of the various disciplines offered by UMAK and 60 private individuals belonging to the different facets of small businesses in the city of Makati who were recipients of the programs facilitated and offered by the office from the time its new administration have handled the operation of CELEN in 2009 up to the present. The findings revealed that the respondents perceived the extent of the benefits they had gained from the entrepreneurial and livelihood training programs to be to a **“much extent”** in terms of social, economic, political, cultural and technological benefits.*
